<u>Leadership in the Body of Christ – Part 1</u>

Review

- □ The church in the NT is described as a body with many members (Rom. 12:4-5). TCC is a new body with members that have different backgrounds, teachings, maturity, gifts..., but we must learn to **function** as one body to do God's will.
- ☐ Jesus is the head of the body (church): He rules over the church with all authority & the church is to be submissive to Him in loving obedience. If we (the body) are to function properly, we must obey the instruction of the Head by His word & Spirit.
- ☐ There are two offices or official roles for leadership in NT: Overseer & Deacon (Phil. 1:1).
- I. The Office of an Overseer (1Tim. 3:1)
 - A. The calling is from God (Ac. 20:28)

 This role in the body is assigned by God Himself, not by man's choosing or preference. The same irresistible power that saves a sinner, calls a man to this role (Phil. 2:13).
 - B. The office or role is established by God (1Tim. 3:1)

 The head of the church has established that this role is
 necessary "noble task". This is labor or work for the
 church. God defines the work as good or noble even though
 there will be opposition, hurt, abuse & misuse from people.
 The biblical name of the office is "ἐπισκοπή" which is
 translated overseer or bishop.
 - C. The office is reserved for male leadership (1Tim. 2:11-14)

 Also "the husband of one wife" & "manage ... household".

 There are serious consequences for leaders (Jas. 3:1).
- II. The Qualifications of an Overseer (1Tim. 3:2-7; Tit. 1:6-9)
 - A. Observe the man in his personal life
 - Sober-minded (balanced thinking/reasoning; restraint)
 - Self-controlled (wise; thoughtful; in control of emotions under pressure)
 - Respectable (Well-ordered; well-arranged)
 - **Not** a drunkard (*Not addicted to alcohol or drugs*)
 - **Not** violent (*No physical abuse in anger*)
 - Gentle (Gracious & yielding while powerful)

- **Not** quarrelsome (*Not argumentative or contentious*)
- **Not** a lover of money (*Rejects gaining money by compromising biblical principles*)
- B. Observe the man in his family life
 - Husband of one wife (*if married, not polygamous; not unbiblically divorced [Mt. 19:9; 1Co. 7:15]; loves wife*)
 - Hospitable (*Enjoys sharing home with others*)
 - Manages his own household well (*Demonstrates wise leadership at home*)
 - Keeping his children submissive (children willingly obey him; including older children living at home Tit. 1:6)

Church life is a mirror of family life (1Tim. 3:5)!

- C. Observe the man in his church life
 - Able to teach (*Gifted* to effectively communicate God's truth to a assembly of gathered believers & unbelievers)
 - Not a recent convert (Mature Christian having been tested with various trials of life); temptations are many...
- D. Observe the man in his life among unbelievers
 - Well thought of by outsiders (*Respected by unbelievers*); not a hypocrite outside church this is the devil' snare/trap!

Above Reproach in all these areas: Willing to correct any legitimate sin in any area of his life; no willful hidden areas of sin III. The Duties of an Overseer

Shepherd or pastor (ποιμαίνω – Ac. 20:28; 1Pe. 5:2):

- A. Leading & protecting = RULING (1Tim. 3:4-5; 5:17) This involves establishing priorities, discerning needs, resolving conflict, decision-making, etc.
- B. Feeding = ministry of the word (1Tim. 3:2; 2Tim. 4:1-2) *This involves teaching, preaching & counseling.*
- C. Caring for practical needs

 This involves food (Ac. 6:1-2), health (Jas. 5:14) & finances
 (Ac. 4:37; 5:2). In order to maintain teaching & ruling
 priorities, these duties may be <u>delegated to deacons</u> but the
 overseer is ultimately responsible!

CONCLUSION

Now my beloved brothers & sisters in Christ, we spent our time today looking at the character & duties of an overseer. But you know that an overseer is placed in the body as an example for you to fulfill your role & calling in this body and for you to strive to live up to the high moral character that Jesus (the Head) requires of us all (Phil. 2:15). So would you hold these qualities up before your own life as a mirror & see where you stand? Are you sober-minded, respectable, gentle, free from love of money, etc.? If so, thank the Lord & ask Him to continue to help you grow in these areas. If not pray, ask the Lord for true repentance & power to change... And pray for me that I would also know true repentance where I need to be conformed more into the image of Christ...

If you are not a Christian, you cannot change by your own power & simply decide you want to take up the character qualities. No my friend you must be changed from the inside; your thoughts, desires, will & emotions must all be radically changed. You must be born again. The gospel...

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
