Introduction

- □ Biblical festivals glorify God & edify His people
- □ Biblical festivals are fulfilled in Christ (Col. 2:16-17)
- □ The Lord's Passover required a sacrificial lamb be killed & Christ is the NT Passover Lamb (Lev. 23:4-5; 1Co. 5:7b)
- □ The Feast of Unleavened Bread required bread without yeast be eaten for 7 days (Lev. 23:6-8)
- □ The Feast of Unleavened Bread means a holy lifestyle is required for true worship (1Co. 5:6-8)
- I. The Origin of the Feast of Firstfruits (Lev. 23:9-14)
 - A. Divine origin (v. 9-10a)

The Lord (Yahweh) instituted the Feast of Firstfruits with divine authority (v. 9). God's message was to His people who should <u>understand</u> & would <u>obey</u> (v. 10a).

B. Divine instruction (v. 10b-14) This feast was to be celebrated the first Sunday in the week of Unleavened Bread (v. 11b). A sheaf (heap) of barley grain was brought to the priest along with a sacrificial lamb & a meal offering to the Lord (v. 11-14).

Believers must worship & thank God for his past provisions & protection.

- II. The Significance of the Feast of Firstfruits
 - A. OT saints

This was a reminder of the promised land of Canaan (v. 10b) – "When you come into the land that I will give you". This was a reminder of God's past deliverance from slavery, provisions & future faithfulness.

B. NT saints

Firstfruits represent: the first Christian converts (Jas. 1:18), the Holy Spirit (Rom. 8:23) & Christ's resurrection (1Co. 15:20). The first 3 feasts are linked together in <u>the same week</u> – Passover, Unleavened Bread & Firstfruits. In reference to Jesus, these represent his death, burial & resurrection.

Believers must worship & thank God for the great resurrection yet to come!
