## God's Purpose and Prerogative - Part 4

## Introduction

- □ Election is the prerogative of God to choose specific individuals for salvation & eternal life before birth or creation.
- God's purpose of election is independent of the individuals involved, their deeds or their potential in life (v. 10-11).
- □ God's purpose of election is just [fair] without fault because of His holy character & sovereignty (v. 14-15, 19-20).
- □ God's purpose of election is merciful excluding human merit while upholding His glory & divine prerogative (v. 16-18). "You did not choose me, but I chose you..."
- □ God's purpose of election reveals His glory in accepting some people & rejecting others which involves wrath & redemption (v. 12-13, 21-24).
- I. God's Purpose Involves Present Service (Rom. 9:21-26)
  - A. A vessel for honorable use (Rom. 9:21)

    It is a great honor & privilege to be in the family of God (1Jn. 3:1; Ps. 23:1;

    Eph. 2:19) children, sheep & citizens. But we are not in the family to be idle, lazy or unproductive. We are vessels for God's use. God Himself determines what is honorable may involve trials, tests & suffering for righteousness sake (Mt. 5:10-11; Jas. 1:2-3; 1Pe. 4:12). Job experienced the plans God had for his use financial loss, death of children, sickness, discouragement, etc. Our bodies are a living sacrifice for God (Rom. 12:1).
  - B. A vessel of mercy (Rom. 9:23-26)

    Mercy implies that all sinners are in desperate need of God's help helpless.

    God reveals the abundance of His mercy by saving some of the worst sinners –

    Gentiles (v. 24). Gentiles had no knowledge of God's law, commandments,

    promises, etc. lived in spiritual darkness & sin (v. 25-26). Gentiles grew up

    in darkness, all they knew & loved was darkness; loved sin & hated God yet

    God has called these wicked sinners to salvation by His abundant mercy. God

    still saves some of the worst sinners liars, thieves, alcoholics, drugadicts,

    fornicators, homosexuals, swindlers, convicts, etc. "And such were some of

    you. But you were washed..." (1Co. 6:11). "But God, being rich in mercy...

    (Eph. 2:4-5). All believers are vessels of mercy!
- II. God's Purpose Involves Future Glory (Rom. 8:28-30)
  - A. All things work together for good (Rom. 8:28-29)
    God is the potter (Creator) & people are the clay (that which is created). The
    Potter already knows the image for the clay what He's making. The
    Almighty Potter can use all of the circumstances of life to shape the clay into
    the perfect image of beauty & grace (v. 28). God's "purpose" is that every
    believer would be conformed into the image of Christ "good" (v. 29). Christ
    was the "firstborn" & example for all the rest of God's children we will be
    like Him (Phil. 1:6).
  - B. All saints are destined for glory (Rom. 8:30)

    Every verb in this passage is in the past tense "foreknew", "predestined",

    "called", "justified" & "glorified". God considers it already done; every saint is

glorified to God – nothing can prevent the saint from being glorified (8:31-38). The sufferings that believers endure in life are insignificant compared to our future glory (8:18).

**ILL**: Many medications have a warning notification, "WARNING: Use this product only as directed" or "This product is safe only for its intended use". Many household products have a similar warning, "This product is effective only for its intended use". Certain kitchen utensils are only effective for their intended use: slicing eggs, dicing tomatoes, grading cheese, mixing batters, etc. These products have a shelf life or a period of usefulness & then they must be thrown away.

**APPL**: Likewise Christian have a similar warning from God: we will only be effective when we function in what God has called us to do. The Master has made us for a specific purpose in life & we are useful for a limited period time. But thank God He does not throw us away when our time & usefulness is up; but we go home to be with the Lord forever & ever!
