<u>Learning from Affliction – Part 7</u>

Introduction and Review

- □ Last week we considered what Job learned from Affliction (Jas. 5:10-11)
- **D** Job learned that the Lord is compassionate & merciful
- $\hfill\square$ The Lord is compassionate when He cares for us in affliction
- **D** The Lord is merciful when He forgives our failures in affliction
- □ Job is an example of suffering & patience (not of health, wealth, influence, accomplishments, etc.)
- I. Job Learned More About God
 - A. Omnipotence (v. 2a) Job had been reminded with conviction that God is the Creator, Sustainer & Ruler of all His creation. Job had been reminded with conviction that God can do anything & nothing is impossible for Him (Mt. 19:26). This conviction & confession is <u>before</u> God has changed any of Job's circumstances!
 - B. Purpose (v. 2b)

Job had been reminded with conviction that God has a divine purpose for all of His actions – even affliction. Because God is omnipotent, all of His plans & purposes will certainly be accomplished (Is. 46:9-10).

- II. Job Learned More About Himself
 - A. Unwise thoughts & words (v. 3b-4) People often reach wrong conclusions in affliction (regretful thoughts & words). Many times we are trying to & asking God to change or remove hardships that we don't even understand (v. 3b-c). God Himself humbles a believer while in pain & suffering – stops us from questioning God's care & purposes (v. 4).
 - B. Limited view of God (v. 5-6)

Severe afflictions test our faith in God's word. Afflictions force us to apply what have learned about God & ourselves – personal experience (v. 5). True repentance comes from true knowledge of God & ourselves (v. 6; 2Tim. 2:25).
