Grace in Humility

Introduction and Review

- □ The grace of God gives people the ability to hear from God or understand spiritually (Mt. 11:15a).
- ☐ The grace of God gives people the ability to obey what is heard from God or understood spiritually (Mt. 11:15b).
- ☐ The grace of God gives people the ability to hear from people or understand spiritually (Jas. 1:19).
- ☐ The grace of God gives people the ability to obey wise counsel from people (Jas. 1:19).
- □ Believers must take care to discern wise counsel from God and other people in order to live by & obey the will of God!
- I. Grace in Humility toward God (Jas. 4:6-10; 1Pe. 5:6)
 - A. Pride impedes a relationship with God (Jas. 4:6a-b)
 God gives the believer grace (special ability) to handle any
 godly demand in life. The grace of God demands a response
 from the believer obedience or disobedience. Pride (in this
 context) is a sinful attitude of rebellion & independence
 toward God. "God opposes the proud" means God will
 bring or allow the consequences of sin disgrace &
 destruction (Pr. 11:2; 16:18; Jas. 4:17; Rom. 1:18-32).
 - B. Humility enriches a relationship with God (Jas. 4:6c-10)

 How is humility accomplished in order to receive more

 grace from God? "Submit" (ὑποτάσσω) means to willingly

 place oneself under the authority of God surrender your

 will. "Resist" or stand firm against the devil prayer & the

 word of God (Eph. 6:11f; Mt. 4:1-11). "Draw near" thru

 repentance & confession (v. 8-9). When God exalts the

 humble believer, then God receives the praise (v. 10).

APPL: How do you respond to what you hear from God – prayer, reading scriptures, bible study, sermons, counsel, etc.? How do you respond to what you know is right? Pride rejects & resists God when He calls for change. Pride always leads to disgrace & destruction. Humility willingly accepts the will of God as good & best; and the humble believer willingly obeys God. The grace of God will give you the ability to obey God from your heart!

II. Grace in Humility toward People (1Pe. 5:5-9)

- A. Pride impedes a relationship with people Pride is also a sinful attitude of independence toward other people. Pride results in bitter jealousy, selfish ambition, quarrels, fights, coveting, ungodly prayers, etc. (Jas. 3:14-4:4; 1Pe. 4:3). Pride is sin & results in even more sin that damages relationships with other people!
- B. Humility enriches a relationship with people After a believer has become humble before God, then the believer can be humble with people (1Pe. 5:6). Humility in a believer willingly accepts the fact that God has established an order church (5:5), family (3:1-7), government (2:13-17) & employment (2:18-21). A believer must not worry about submission in humility prayer is the remedy (5:7; Phil. 4:6-7). A believer must resist the devil's temptation to pride & rebellion thru prayer (5:8-9; Eph. 6:11f).

APPL: Satan is an adversary battling to keep a believer from being humble – before God & with people. Pride is an inward temptation battling to keep the believer from being humble. But the grace of God gives the believer victory over Satan, pride and every other sin in this battle for humility!
