Grace in Thanksgiving

Introduction and Review

- □ <u>Pride impedes</u> a relationship with God because God opposes the proud (Jas. 4:6a-b).
- Humility enriches a relationship with God because God gives more grace to the humble (Jas. 4:6c-10).
- Pride impedes a relationship with people because it leads to jealousy, selfishness, fights, quarrels, etc. (Jas. 3:14-4:4).
- Humility enriches a relationship with people because a believer can willingly accepts God's functional & submissive order in life church, family, government & employment (1Pe. 2:13-5:9).
- □ By grace God gives the believer victory over Satan, pride & every other sin in this battle for humility (**1Pe. 5:12**)!
- I. Grace in Thanksgiving for Gospel Privileges
 - A. Thanksgiving must come from the heart (Col. 3:16)
 Grace (χάρις) is sometimes translated "thanks", "thankfulness" or "thanksgiving". The heart is defined biblically as the inward center of a person that controls thinking, will & emotions. The heart is affected & persuaded by information truth or error (Rom. 6:17). The word & Spirit of God in the heart produce thankfulness (Col. 3:16).
 - B. Thanksgiving includes privileges to serve (1Tim. 1:12)

 Grace enables a believer to remember their past sins without ungodly guilt & shame death of Christ removes the guilt & His acceptance removes shame. Grace enables the believer to be thankful for gospel ministry in spite of past sins. Grace enables the believer to serve Christ with a clear conscience in spite of past sins (2Tim. 1:3).

ILL: I did not earn or merit the privileges of teaching, preaching & pastoring in ministry. These privileges are not based on my natural accomplishments or successes in life. It's all of grace in spite of my failures & sins, therefore I am thankful!

APPL: The same is true of you regardless of – you did not earn or merit it. Any gospel ministry or service that you render for Christ is all of grace in spite of your sin – THANKFULNESS!!!

II. Grace in Thanksgiving for Gospel Blessings

- A. Thanksgiving for deliverance (Rom. 6:17; 7:25; 1Co. 15:57) Deliverance from <u>slavery to sin</u> & <u>slavery to the flesh</u> is a great blessing of salvation (Rom. 6:17; 7:25). Another great blessing is deliverance from the <u>fear & awful consequences</u> of death (1Co. 15:57). These blessings were not merited thanksgiving!
- B. Thanksgiving for provisions (1Co. 10:30; 2Co. 9:15; 8:16)
 Believers should be thankful for food (1Co. 10:30).
 Believers should also be thankful for financial provisions (2Co. 9:15). Believers should be thankful for other people to assist in ministry (2Co. 8:16). None of these provisions are merited thanksgiving!
- C. Thanksgiving for success in evangelism (2Co. 2:14)

 Grace enables the believer to have love for God & people –
 believers & unbelievers. God gives the desire & power for
 evangelism and He controls the outcome (v. 16) –
 thanksgiving!

ILL: I have not lived 61 years in good health because I earned it or merited it. I did many unwise things to endanger my health. I am fully aware that my health, protection, deliverance, provisions & any success in ministry is all of grace — totally unmerited. **APPL:** The same is true of you regardless of your age, condition of your health, financial & family status or your effectiveness in evangelism — you did not earn it. All of these gospel blessings are of grace in spite of your failures & sin — THANKFULNESS!!!
