## <u> A Cheerful Giver – Part 3</u>

Introduction and Review

- □ Paul gives more reasons for believers to give generously & cheerfully (v. 8):
- □ God is limitless in His capability "God is able"
- □ God is limitless in resources "make all grace abound to you"
- □ God provides all sufficient resources <u>all</u> needs in <u>all</u> circumstances <u>all</u> the time
- □ God provides enough to support every godly ministry
- I. Righteousness in Giving Generously (v. 9-10)
  - A. God cares for the poor (v. 9) Giving to the poor is a sign of a right relationship with God – "righteousness" (1Jn. 3:17). God is faithful to motivate believers to give generously as an act of righteousness (1Jn. 2:29) – "his righteousness endures forever".
  - B. God increases resources (v. 10) God provides financial resources for the giver to help the needy – "supply". God promises to supernaturally increase the effectiveness of resources given to those in need – "multiply" & "increase" (Mt. 14:13-21).
    God's righteousness is revealed as believers care for those in need.

## II. Thanksgiving in Giving Generously (v. 11-12)

- A. Generosity produces thanksgiving (v. 11)
   When believers have generous hearts, God is generous to them spiritually & physically "enriched" (πλουτίζω). Generosity from believers produces thanksgiving to God from recipients.
- B. Generosity involves worship (v. 12)
  "For the ministry of this service" (λειτουργία) is a service of worship (Rom. 12:1-2). Giving money as an act of worship results in meeting physical needs & offering spiritual thanksgiving.

Generosity is an act of worship that provides physical needs & produces thanksgiving!
