## Waiting to See the Lord

## Introduction

- □ Believers in the OT era had been waiting for centuries to see the promised Messiah.
- ☐ Mary & Joseph were surprise to learn that they would see the promised Messiah as His parents.
- □ Heb. 11:1. The Holy Spirit kept hope & anticipation vibrant in their hearts just as He does in ours.
- I. Jesus is **Brought** by His Parents (2:22-24)
  - A. The child's consecration

    The purpose: "to present" or consecrate Jesus for the

    Lord's service. All 1<sup>st</sup> born creatures belonged to God –

    either sacrificed or redeemed with money (Num. 18:15-16).

    Jesus was consecrated for service rather than redeemed with
    money.
  - B. The mother's purification

    After the birth of a son there were 7 days of uncleanness & 33 days for purification (Lev. 12:1-8). The ceremony involved sacrificing an animal at the temple Joseph & Mary were poor. Poor people sacrificed 2 turtledoves or pigeons since they did not have & couldn't afford a lamb.

Joseph & Mary loved God & obeyed His law (1Jn. 5:3; Gal. 4:4).

- II. Jesus is **Revealed** to Simeon (2:25-35)
  - A. The Holy Spirit controlled Simeon (v. 25-27)

    The HS deals with different people in different ways filled, quench, etc. The HS had been working in Simeon granting grace to wait for God's Deliverer, revealing longevity of life & timing for him to act. God never leaves to the plan of redemption to chance; He chooses, reveals, convicts, leads...
  - B. The Holy Spirit enabled Simeon (v. 28-35)

    The HS gives power. The HS enabled Simeon to take hold of God's Deliverer, to bless God, prophesy the truth about Jesus & bless Mary & Joseph. The HS prepared Simeon to die in peace with God (as he had lived). No one is ready to die until you have seen & believed Jesus in your heart. Only then are you ready to both live & die (Phil. 1:21).

This 40 day old infant is ordained/appointed by God to save Jews & Gentiles; He is appointed for the salvation of some & judgment of others; and Mary will experience grief & anguish in her heart because of the awful ways that Jesus will suffer... God is revealing the Truth about this child & all who will be eternally affected by Him!

- III. Jesus is **Praised** by Anna (2:36-38)
  - A. Jesus is worthy of sacrifice (v. 36-37)

    Anna married & became a widow at a young age (<30 yrs. old); she had other option remarriage, rejoin family, etc.

    But she chose to fully devote her youth, talents & skills to serve the Lord in the place of worship. Just one look made all the sacrifice worth while; just being in His presence...
  - B. Jesus is worthy of praise (v. 38)

    As a prophetess, Anna was also chosen & used by the Holy

    Spirit to speak for God. Anna was a mouthpiece for God in

    praise & proclamation.
